ORFORD CEVA PRIMARY SCHOOL

THE FRIEND'S GARAGE SITE

For more than 35 years, my staff and I ran Friend's Garage as a service to the community. All good things come to an end and when I closed the garage, as a final offering to the village, I was prepared to release the most valuable part of the site, Seaforth House, to the fledgling Community Interest Company (CIC) in order that they might build a suitable new shop for the community. I agreed the terms for the sale of Seaforth House with a gentleman's handshake.

In order to satisfy the terms of the Asset of Community Value (ACV) listing, planning policy required the inclusion of a commercial property suitable for the employment of 3 full time workers on the site. Subsequently, it soon became obvious that the CIC were of the opinion that they were in a position to dictate terms. In the intervening 32 months, the CIC has attempted to stall the developer (Northland) in every conceivable manner. In order to try and keep the project on track, Northland has agreed to many concessions, both financial and contractual, which would not normally even be considered in a commercial development. Early this year, the CIC made a substantial reduction of more than 75% to the agreed price for their portion of the site and as a result, I withdrew Seaforth House, which did not form part of the ACV listing, from the scheme.

The developer (Northland) is part of a professional, experienced team which would not submit a scheme which contains any of the rudimentary flaws and omissions mentioned by Mr Cole in his recent leaflet. The commercial space proposed by Northland is nearly 3.5 times the size of the current shop and storage. This, combined with the provision of 2 affordable properties for rent, one for discount market sale and enough open market houses to make the scheme viable, should result in a development to satisfy everyone concerned.

Preliminary results from the recent survey indicate that the majority of the respondents approve of the currently proposed scheme. After nearly 3 years of negotiations, it would be so refreshing if the CIC truly represented the community and started to work sensibly with Northland rather than fight their every suggestion. Northland remains determined to develop Friend's Garage for the benefit of the village.

I am perfectly aware that the old garage has become an eyesore, but should the ongoing negativity continue, the site could deteriorate further for several more years to come. This is not what I want for the community. There is a positive way forward: it is unfortunate the CIC can't – or won't – see it.

CHRISTMAS TRADING AT ORFORD GENERAL STORE

We would like let you know that that we will be closing for four days over the festive period. This year has been incredibly hard on our staff, who have rallied to all the challenges that Covid, the weather and short-staffing throws at them, and we would like to reward them with the opportunity to spend time with their families. We hope that by giving you early notice of our intentions we can avoid any inconvenience to our customers.

Royal Mail last postal dates are on the back page of this issue. CUSTOMS FORMS: please can we ask that before you seal your parcel, you prepare a list of EVERY item that is inside, with its individual weight, individual value, and quantity of each item, and country of manufacture. This list must also include any correspondence/greetings cards. Customs forms may be filled in at the Post Office, and our staff are happy to help. All forms must be completed in black ink, and BLOCK CAPITALS, as they are computer-read, and illegible mail will no longer be forwarded, meaning that you may lose the price of your goods, and your postage too! All mail the size of a large letter and above will require a completed form. All parcels are scanned, so please list all goods within the parcel, with a full description, i.e. 'Clothing' is no longer acceptable, and an example of required description would be, 'men's blue denim jeans.'

For those struggling to buy gifts, please remember the Post Office also stocks One4all gift cards, which can be used at over 2,500 sites across the UK and online. These gift cards are the only card to be financially guaranteed.

Finally, I'd like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas, and thank you all for your continued support, custom and friendship this year on behalf of myself, Sue Snowden and our whole team. Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to you all.
