THE FESTIVAL OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS

For many, the broadcast of the annual Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols from King's College, Cambridge, marks the beginning of Christmas. The structure of the service was originally the work of EW Benson, Bishop of Truro, but it was developed by Eric Milner-White, Dean of King's College, Cambridge, in the aftermath of World War I; in the Bidding Prayer, he recalled 'all those who rejoice with us, but upon another shore and in a greater light'. Milner-White described its appeal to people of faith, and of none, thus: 'The centre of the service is still found by those who go "in heart and mind" and who consent to follow where the story leads.'

The '9LC', as we abbreviate it, continues to inspire musicians to bring the very best music and congregational carols to complement the readings as the nativity story unfolds. Carol services will be held at Christmas all over the benefice – at a church near you.

Orford's 9LC is at 5pm on Sunday 22 December. Beginning with 'Once in Royal David's City', there will be nine familiar carols for everyone to sing. Highlights from the choir music include a King's College commissioned work about the Annunciation by Matthew Martin — 'Angelus ad Virginem' — which is challenging to sing, wonderful to listen to, and has an outstanding organ accompani-

ment. And we will mark the 200th birthday anniversary of the Austrian composer Anton Bruckner with one of his beautiful Christmas motets.

Do come and join us to hear the Christmas story, to sing the familiar carols, and to experience the joy of beautiful, uplifting music with our choir and our wonderful organ.

NOTE FROM ORFORD POST OFFICE: if you are posting a parcel internationally, it is advisable to complete a Customs Form on the Royal Mail website. This will then ensure that you have listed accurately all the contents and weights of your parcel's individual contents, (including any correspondence). You will then be provided with a QR code which you bring along to the Post Office on your phone etc when you are ready to dispatch, and we print out your completed customs form for you. This saves parcels being significantly delayed in their transition to the country to which they are being posted, and ensures no items are forgotten which may cause a parcel to be delayed, or worse, destroyed! Should you try to enter goods which are prohibited for international postage, the Royal Mail site will inform you, saving you from bringing parcels down, and being refused service!
