ORFORD & GEDGRAVE – HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

We need your help.

For some time, the Parish Council has been concerned that the lack of affordable housing in the parish is preventing local people from continuing to live in the parish that they have long called their home. As such, we are working with Community Action Suffolk – an independent charity – to carry out a Housing Needs Survey. This would provide the evidence that would either support or otherwise, our concern and potentially provide a pathway towards the delivery of a small local affordable housing scheme. The survey will also seek to establish what type of homes would be required by local people.

Housing needs can be varied and are not just about affordability. You might be looking for your first home, you might need a larger home, or you may be looking to downsize to somewhere easier to manage over the next few years. The survey should also pick up hidden needs, for example, people living outside the village with a connection to Orford and Gedgrave, working for a local business or organization for example, or who would like to return, or move here, if the right kind of housing was available.

Part One of the survey is for ALL residents to complete. It will seek views from every household about housing.

Part Two is for completion by households or individuals who consider themselves to be in need of housing.

A paper copy of the survey will be delivered to your home and local businesses. The survey must be returned directly to Community Action Suffolk using the pre-paid envelope provided, however where possible we would like surveys to be completed online using the unique code that will be provided.

Although commissioned by the Parish Council, the survey will be completely independent, and your privacy will be respected. The results will be analysed by Community Action Suffolk and at no stage will any personal information be shared with the Parish Council or any third parties. Surveys will be delivered in the first week of June 2025 and the closing date for returns will be 1 July 2025.

Finally, if you are interested in occupying an Affordable house and feel that you might be eligible, we would encourage you to register with www.gatewaytohomechoice.org.uk as that will further evidence of an affordable housing need in the parish.

Orford Museum is delighted to welcome the travelling theatre group Three Inch Fools (www.threeinchfools.com) to Butley

Priory on Tuesday 26 August 2025 to present a musical version of Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream.* Formed in 2015 by brothers James and Stephen Hyde, the idea for the Three-Inch Fools is simple – to stage a production that is inventive and fast-paced and to use music to bring to life Shakespeare's timeless stories. Over the past seven years the company has staged fourteen plays around the UK including *Macbeth, Romeo and Juliet* and *Twelfth Night*. The performance will start at 6.30pm (doors open at 6pm) and will take place outside, so please bring chairs, rugs and a picnic. There will be a twenty-minute interval.

Looking ahead to autumn, on Monday 8 September, Ian Collins will talk about his book *Blythe Spirit: The Remarkable Life of Ronald Blythe.* Ronald Blythe (1922-2023), author of the inimitable *Akenfield*, was a prolific and poetic chronicler of rural and spiritual life, nature and literature. He spent a joyful century close to his Suffolk roots, time-travelling in his imagination and publishing forty-five books and thousands of essays. Ian Collins has drawn on decades of friendship for an intimate and candid biography. Ian Collins is a radio and television presenter, author, comedy writer and journalist. He was for many years arts writer for the Eastern Daily Press. His numerous biographies and monographs include *John Craxton: A life of Gifts* and *James Dodds: The Blue Boat.*

On Thursday 2 October, Peter Gutteridge returns to Butley Priory to continue his very popular series of talks on Nelson with one entitled 'Nelson – Disaster at Tenerife and the Battle of the Nile', and on Thursday 6 November, well-known journalist and Woodbridge resident, Simon Pearson, will talk about his book *The Great Escaper: the Life and Death of Roger Bushell*, published by Hodder in 2013 – after being given exclusive access to his papers and letters by Bushell's family.


